Creating Lasting Impact in TOPP's Final Year

As the U.S. organic market continues to grow, 2026 marks not only a decisive moment for farmers considering transitioning, but also the final year of the Transition to Organic Partnership Program (TOPP).

TOPP was created to do more than spark short-term interest in organic production—it builds networks and provides assistance that make organic certification attainable on a scale never before

seen. The program's national impact backs up this mission: over 2,200 events hosted, more than 5,200 people receiving technical assistance, and over 2,600 mentorship pairs established.

In the Plains region, organic transition can be daunting. Large acreage, long distances between partners, and region-specific production challenges mean that success depends on strong relationships and shared knowledge. TOPP helps bridge those gaps by connecting producers with trusted technical assistance, peer networks, and regionally relevant resources.
